What is IYMP?

IYMP is a Commonwealth Government initiative administered by the Department of Education Science and Training. Nyaarla Projects, an Indigenous owned and managed company based in Perth, manages the IYMP in Western Australia.

The Indigenous Youth Mobility Programme (IYMP) provides Indigenous Australians the opportunity to enrol into post high school training and education programs in Perth leading to employment.

If you're an Indigenous Australian:

- between the ages of 16 and 24 years of age
- living in remote and regional areas &
- have the equivalent of a year 10 education, read on ...

How will it help?

Through IYMP in Western Australia, participants:

- Will undertake formal training and/or education in Perth (this can, but does not have to be linked to employment eg. via an apprenticeship, cadetship or traineeship)
- Will receive safe and supported accommodation through Aboriginal Hostels Limited
- May receive assistance with transport costs
- Will receive mentoring and support during the training/education in Perth
- Receive assistance in finding relevant employment in their home region at the completion of the training/education
- May be linked with support and mentoring in their workplace when they return to their region on completion of the training/education.

IYMP Objectives

The IYMP will support the development of local economic and job opportunities for young Indigenous Australians living in remote and regional areas by achieving the following objectives:

- Improve access to training and education opportunities in major centres for young Indigenous Australians from remote and regional communities
 - Increase the number of young Indigenous Australians participating in accredited training and education
 - Increase the number of Indigenous Australians employed in occupations in particular areas of community need (including but not limited to trades, nursing, accountancy, business management and teaching)
 - Support the economic development in remote communities by building the capacity of local Indigenous youth to take up skilled jobs in their communities.
