They are required to have involvement in teaching and a proven ability to teach upper school in their field of study. To provide a caring and exceptional educational environment for all students within a specific class during an academic year. All Teachers must fulfil the 'Proficient Levels" in all of the AITSL Australian National Standards for Teachers. Teachers report directly to the Head of Learning Area, who in turn reports directly to the Head of Campus. 	
Role requirements:	 <u>Teaching and learning</u> Establish expectations for each student which are clear, challenging and achievable. Generate student interest, enthusiasm and motivation and make learning meaningful. Demonstrate thorough preparation and purposeful planning which caters for the differing needs of students. Use a range of effective strategies to support student learning and thinking. Use effective management which provides a teaching climate conducive to learning. Use a range of diagnostic and formative assessment processes to monitor student performance. Maintain effective communication with students and parents concerning each student's learning program and progress. Demonstrate awareness of the particular educational needs of different groups of students and the capacity to develop strategies to meet these needs. 	



 Select, plan and facilitate annual excursions and incursions, that develop students' awareness and understanding of a broad range of art practices and styles. Organise and supervise additional workshop time, outside of school hours, to enable Upper School students to fulfill the production requirements of their course.
