UNRAVELING ABSTUDY FOR PARENTS

- Payments are every term based on how many days student attended school
- These payments are Means Tested based on the guardian's income

Boarding students

- If you live more than 'reasonable travelling time or distance' from the local high school:
 - You can only get ABSTUDY if you have a scholarship from the Boarding School or a Third Party Provider. If you do not have a scholarship you may not qualify
 - The ABSTUDY Fare Allowance is not Means Tested and allows for travel to and from school
 - Other fees are Means Tested
- If you live **less than** 'reasonable travelling time or distance' from the local high school:
 - You can get ABSTUDY regardless of if you have a scholarship
 - The ABSTUDY Fare Allowance is not Means Tested and allows for travel to and from school
 - Other allowances are Means Tested
- You can sometimes bypass the local high school if it is a 'limited program school' and does not offer a specific program you want your child to go to (such as music or agriculture)
- Boarding School scholarships direct from the School must be the higher value of \$6,096 or 25% of the fees

What you need to apply:



- Guardian's **Centrelink Number:** CRN if you do not have one you will need to apply
- **Proof of Aboriginality** for the Student from your Land Council
- If your child is over 16 they will need a **Tax** File Number (TFN) – call the tax office on 13 10 30 for the Aboriginal Hotline and ask for form number: *NAT1589-07.2016* to be sent to you

How to apply:

- 1. Call ABSTUDY on 1800 132 317 and answer questions on the phone
- 2. ABSTUDY will send out forms which you need to sign
- 3. Send the forms back with any other information they require
- 4. Ask them to send you a Letter of Estimate of what you could receive from ABSTUDY It is recommended you wait to accept a school placement until after you know how much you could get, as there may be a gap to pay

'Orientation Visit Travel' is for students to visit the school with a family member

- This can only be used **before** acceptance to a school, once accepted it is no longer useable
- Can be used for interviews or selection process







Parent's Entitlements

- 'Special Purpose Visit' is for one family member to visit a school, can be used for:
 - If the student is at threat of being expelled
 - If the student has serious problems of adjustment
 - Graduation
 - Parent/Teacher Interviews
 - Other school events, such as sports, plays, NAIDOC, assemblies, award ceremonies, etc.
- Families get 3 per year, which include:
 - Flight to and from Perth
 - Accommodation for 'reasonable time' (approximately two nights)
 - Meals if included in accommodation bill

Student's Entitlements

- Transport from home to school for the beginning of each term (x4)
 - Some students will require a supervisor as determined on case by case basis
 - This can be one parent/family/community member who can travel with the student to Perth and get accommodation for 'reasonable time' (which is approximately two nights), as well as meals if included in accommodation bill
- All transport from school to home at the end of each term (x4)
 - We recommend schools act as a supervisor, but they are not required to
- ABSTUDY DOES NOT cover flights for midterm breaks (3/year)
- 'Compassionate Travel' for students can get a flight home and back to school
 - if there is a critical injury or illness of a family member
 - If there is a funeral of a family member*
 - If there is 'kinship business'
 - If the child is sick or injured and needs to return home
- 'Compassionate Travel' for a family member to get a flight to and from Perth to visit the child
 - If the student has a serious illness or injury
- 'Compassionate Travel' has a 2 per year limit
- Students can travel on weekends, but require a supervisor
