About the Program

The Work Experience in Government (WEX) program aims to provide high performing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in Years 11 and 12 with hands on experience and information about job opportunities and career pathways in the Australian Government, and includes cultural mentoring and leadership guidance for participants.

In 2017 WEX activities may include:

- Meeting senior government Ministers and parliamentarians.
- Visits to the Department of Defence and the Australian Federal Police headquarters.
- Visits to national institutions such as Questacon, the Australian War Memorial, and the Australian Institute of Sport.
- A tour of Parliament House.
- A careers expo, where students can talk to representatives from a range of government agencies.
- A workshop on applying for jobs in the Australian Public Service.

The 2017 program will run from 27 to 31 March in Canberra.

- Enrolled in Year 11 or Year 12.
- Positively engaged and achieving well academically at school.
- Interested in a career in the public sector.
- Supported by your school in attending the program, if you are selected to participate.
- Able to fully participate in the program and interact with other students.
- Emotionally resilient and ready to travel and be away from home for up to five days.
- Prepared and able to travel to and from the event without supervision.
