

Work Experience in Government Program (WEX) Teacher Application Form





About the Program

The Work Experience in Government (WEX) program aims to provide high performing Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in Years 11 and 12 with hands on experience and information about job opportunities and career pathways in the Australian Government, and includes cultural mentoring and leadership guidance for participants.

In 2017 WEX activities may include:

- Meeting senior government Ministers and parliamentarians.
- Visits to the Department of Defence and the Australian Federal Police headquarters.
- Visits to national institutions such as Questacon, the Australian War Memorial, and the Australian Institute of Sport.
- A tour of Parliament House.
- A careers expo, where students can talk to representatives from a range of government agencies.
- A workshop on applying for jobs in the Australian Public Service.

The 2017 program will run from 27 to 31 March in Canberra.

How to Apply

To be considered for the WEX Program, you must:

- Be a registered teacher or a member of support staff at a participating school.
- Have experience working with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students.
- Have a strong interest in supporting Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students to explore career opportunities in the public sector.
- Have the necessary clearances to work with and supervise children (school students).
- Be available for the duration of the program, including travel to and from the program. This may involve collecting students at a state/territory capital airport and travelling with them to Canberra, and ensuring that students make their regional connections on the way home.
- Agree to carry out specific tasks during the program including:
 - » Attending parts of the program as required.
 - » Supervising students at night in their accommodation.
 - » Supervising students who are not enrolled at your school.
 - » Supervising students travelling to and from Canberra if required.
 - » Providing evaluation feedback during and after the program.
 - » Providing support to students after the program (both program participants and students from your school who did not participate in the program), including sharing information about pathways that students can follow in the various areas of government.
