

FREE CHILD DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOPS FOR Y2 to Y6 TEACHERS

In Term 2 2017, the Perth metropolitan Child Development Service (CDS) is offering a series of **free** child development workshops for Year 2 to 6 teachers, with education assistants welcome to attend with the teacher.

These once-off workshops will be delivered by Clinical Psychologists, Paediatricians and Social Workers and will cover the following topics:

- 1. Attention difficulties,
- 2. Relationship-based approach to managing behaviour with children with developmental delays,
- 3. The impact of developmental difficulties on learning.

Please see below for the learning outcomes for each of the above workshops. These workshops will include opportunity for discussion and problem-solving around practical strategies for supporting children with developmental delays in the classroom.

Workshop One – Attention difficulties

Target audience: Teachers of children in Years 2-6 with significant, ongoing attention difficulties (e.g. may include students who are unable to sit still, are disruptive/ withdrawn, are unable to focus/complete assigned tasks without 1:1 support).

Learning Outcomes: For teachers to develop an increased understanding of:

- 1. Attention difficulties, including varying presentations and developmental expectations;
- 2. The factors that may contribute to a child's attention difficulties in the classroom;
- 3. The application of strategies to support children with attention difficulties in the classroom, and greater confidence in applying strategies;
- 4. The importance of providing both school-based observations and feedback from parents when seeking additional support (including referral to the Child Development Service and/or Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service)
- 5. How to collaborate with parents/ caregivers to best engage supports for a child.

Workshop Two – Relationship-based approach to managing behaviour with children with developmental delays

Target audience: Teachers of children in Years 2-6 with considerable, ongoing behavioural difficulties.

Learning Outcomes:

- 1. For teachers to have an increased understanding of:
 - a. The variety of behaviours children may present with and what these behaviours may signify;
 - b. The role of child-significant adult relational attachment in shaping learning and behaviour;
 - c. How to use information available about a child (from both school and family) to seek additional support (including referral to the Child Development Service and/or Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service).
- 2. For teachers to have increased confidence to:
 - a. Collaborate with parents/ caregivers to best engage supports for a child;
 - Implement strategies to support a child with behavioural difficulties in the classroom/ school setting;
 - c. Access resources to support children with behavioural difficulties at school.

Workshop Three – The impact of developmental difficulties on learning

Target audience: Teachers of children in Years 2-6 with considerable and ongoing developmental delays (e.g. delays in the areas of language, speech, handwriting, attention, coordination, etc.).

Learning Outcomes:

- 1. For teachers to have an increased understanding of:
 - a. The impact of developmental delays on learning;
 - b. The variety of presentations that may indicate a developmental difficulty that will affect learning;
 - c. How to use information available about a child (from both school and family) to seek additional support (including referral to the Child Development Service and/or Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service).
- 2. For teachers to have increased confidence to:
 - a. Collaborate with parents/ caregivers to best engage supports for a child;
 - b. Implement strategies to support a child with learning difficulties in the classroom/ school setting;
 - c. Access resources to support children with learning difficulties at school.
