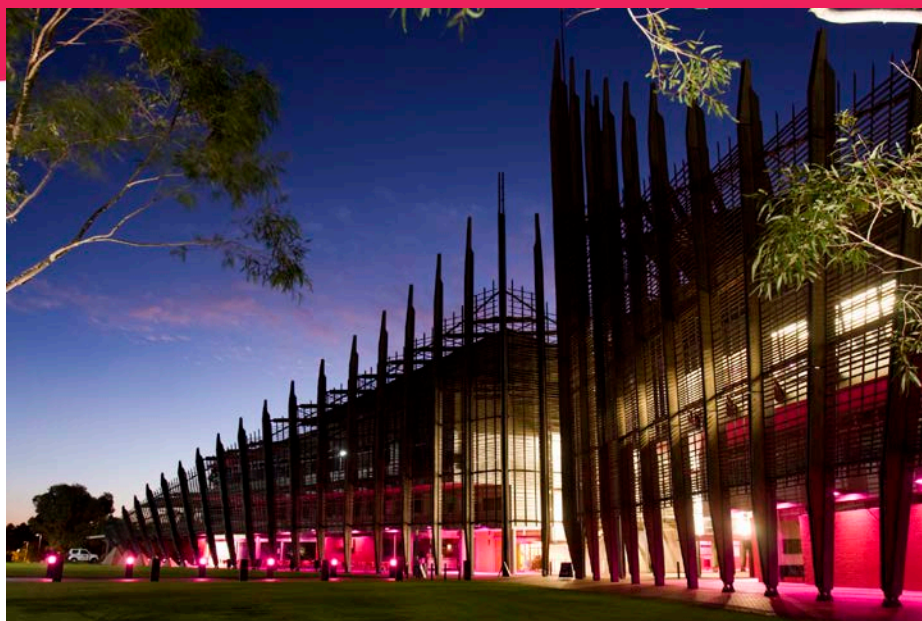


Twilight Seminar Series

Assessment for learning: Strategies for fostering student learning and agency



In this presentation Professor Cowie will share examples from New Zealand classrooms to explore the possibilities for active teacher and student engagement in *Assessment for Learning* (AfL). Drawing on experiences of working with teachers in primary and secondary schools, she will outline AfL as a key educational process that supports student agency and self-assessment. Bronwen will discuss some of the ways in which teachers can develop AfL to positively connect with the culturally diverse perspectives that students bring to their formal education, and use AfL to enhance family involvement in student learning.
