


ETHICS OLYMPIAD

What is an Ethics Olympiad?

The purpose of the Ethics Olympiad is to assist schools as they help students develop important skills such as communication skills, collaboration and critical thinking. Unlike a debate, students are not assigned a position. Rather they take their own considered position in relation to an ethical question. This unique event will interest Gifted and Talented teachers, Social Science Teachers, Philosophy and RE teachers, Principals and School Administrators. The event is designed to provide a focus for schools wanting to develop critical thinking skills in students.

How does it work?

Each school will register a team or two teams of five 'ethletes'. During the day we will use zoom technology to bring students together. All students will be involved in a series of four Ethics Olympiad heats where they will be scored according to set criteria which rewards, clear, concise, respectful discourse around challenging ethical cases. Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals will be awarded to the three top ranked teams

The heats will be run simultaneously- with a common format and common timing. There will be a round robin format with different schools participating against each other. A central timing system and administrator will coordinate the event so that all Heats start and finish at the same time. Teachers will act as judges during the day. Score sheets and criteria will be sent to coaches once you have registered. Scores will be private on the day, but we will email the final results to coaches after the event. Medals will be posted to the schools and a certificate will be emailed to schools to be printed and awarded to students at a school assembly.
