

Teaching the Arts (P-10): 3 day short course for teachers

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Join the Murdoch School of Education for a 3 day short course designed for teachers, presented by arts curriculum specialists, Robin Pascoe and Associate Professor Peter Wright.

From Semester 1 2018, all Western Australian schools will be required to implement the WA P-10 Arts Syllabus. In this 3 day course, Robin and Peter will provide an overview on what to teach in the Arts and how to teach it, covering all five arts subjects - Dance, Drama, Media Arts, Music and Visual Arts. Participants can choose an intensive curriculum focus on either DRAMA or MEDIA ARTS, with extension also offered in the other arts areas (including integrated STEAM arts).

This 3 day course program will provide:

- Opportunities to get into the detail of the syllabus – crunching the syllabus
- Intensive focus on one Arts subject for one session each day – choose from DRAMA or MEDIA ARTS - focusing on year level and content for years P-10 with specific teaching, planning and assessment strategies
- Extension focus on 3 other Arts subjects or Arts Integration - choose one extension workshop each day from Visual Arts / Dance / Drama / Media Arts / Music / Integrated Arts (STEAM), as taught by current teaching artists.



Robin Pascoe

Robin has extensive experience in teaching, writing and implementing arts curriculum in Western Australia. He currently

coordinates teaching the Arts for primary and early childhood education students as well as drama for secondary students at Murdoch University. Robin has previously held supervisory roles within the Department of Education WA, including consultant for the Performing Arts K-12. From 2014-2016 Robin managed the AiR (Artist in Residence) Commission at Murdoch School of Education, a project designed to bring together teaching artists and education students through innovative, practical workshops in dance, drama, media arts, music and visual arts. In 2013, Robin was elected president of IDEA, the International Drama/Theatre and Education Association.



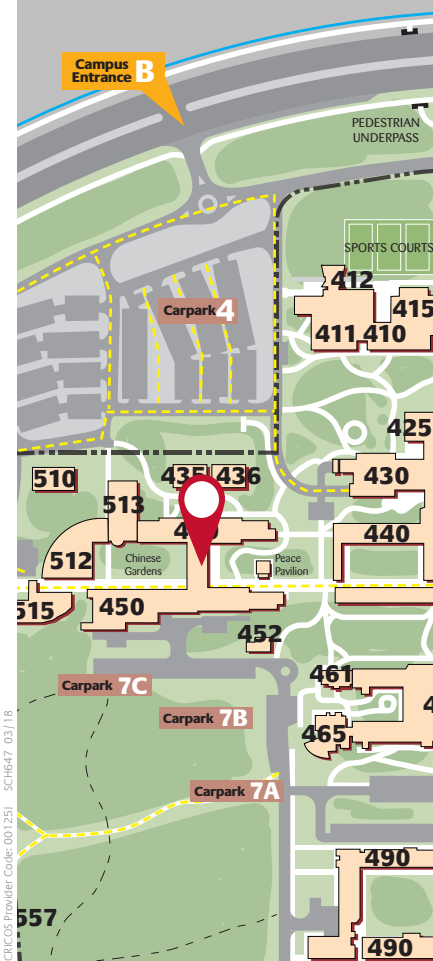
Peter Wright

Peter is an Associate Professor at Murdoch School of Education, and is an active researcher in the fields of socially-engaged arts, community cultural development, and teacher development in the arts. He currently teaches units in arts education, health and wellbeing, and creativity and innovation (including integrated art forms such as STEAM), and has been principal supervisor of many arts-themed PhD theses, including STEAM education and sustainability; the experience of arts specialist teachers in WA primary schools; and drama pedagogy to develop 21st century skills. Central to Peter's work is an interest in how the Arts facilitates learning, expression and inquiry and how this experience is mediated through making, connecting, and expressing.
