Virtual Debating History

- 2014 Ivanhoe Grammar (VIC) and John Paul College (QLD) hold a formal debate using video conferencing
- 2015 Trial competition with 33 teams from 19 schools
- 2016 Formal competition with 64 teams from 35 schools and 70 debates
- 2017 Competition with 96 teams from 47 schools (every state & territory) and 140 debates
- 2018 Competition with 116 teams from 55 schools and 221 debates

How the competition will be working in 2019

Depending on the level of interest for 2019, we hope to again register 128 teams and 250 debates with a 4 x 32 team competition. AISNSW will also make every attempt to structure all competitions in 2019 as 'double elimination'. This means schools must lose twice to be eliminated and will in most cases have 3 or more debates. The EOI registers your serious intent only and is not a final confirmation. After the EOI process, schools will be made an offer and then payment of fees will confirm entry.

Fees for Schools

Fees cannot be confirmed until final numbers are confirmed. The rate is expected to be \$180 per team. The double elimination competitions require more debates and more adjudications, hence the increase in 2018. All schools' registration fees go directly to paying for our adjudicators, the largest cost in administrating the competition.
