Schools are reminded that the Pre-primary to Year 10 English and Health and Physical Education are the first two learning areas within the Western Australian Curriculum and Assessment Outline to be revised as part of adopting and adapting the Australian Curriculum version 9 to the Western Australian context. The revised curriculum for Pre-primary to Year 10 (P–10) English and Health and Physical Education has now been released for familiarisation in 2024 and implementation in 2025.

This adopt and adapt process will continue this year, with work commencing in the Science, Mathematics, Humanities and Social Sciences and Technologies Learning Areas. Schools will be invited to participate in consultation sessions as part of this process.

Updates to WACE courses continue throughout 2024.
