Welcome to the June edition of the CAP News. Earlier this month AISWA's Reconciliation Action Plan was endorsed by Reconciliation Australia. Many years in the making, the plan underscores AISWA's commitment to reconciliation and recognition of the importance of First Nations perspectives and knowledge in shaping a more equitable education system.

The inaugural AISWA leaders conference proved a wonderful opportunity for members to gather, network, and engage with a world class line up of speakers. As we continue implementing our new Strategic Plan, our goal is to ensure the ongoing provision of high-quality, value add learning events for members, driven by their evolving needs and challenges. This week, the Curriculum Reference Group will meet for the second time, and I am looking forward to a rich discussion about Professional Learning, focusing on their expectations, needs and priorities.

A few weeks ago Minister Buti released the *Post-School Success Expert Panel Report: [Consultation Draft](#)*, which includes a comprehensive suite of recommendations. To ensure these appropriately reflect the needs and aspirations for Western Australian young people, the expert panel is seeking feedback on the draft until mid-August. Many recommendations refer to the School Curriculum and Standards Authority, acknowledging the current WACE refreshments and expansion of this work.

Adopt and Adapt Process for the Western Australian Curriculum

- At the time of publication, consultation for the proposed changes to the P-10 Science and Technologies curriculum will have ended.

AITSL Professional Standards for Middle Leaders

- The new Professional Standards for Middle Leaders have been released and identify the key capabilities be effective as a middle leader.
- They acknowledge the key role of middle leaders in schools and are intended to bridge the gap between the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers and the Australian Professional Standard for Principals.

Generative AI Cross Sectoral Pilot Project

- AISWA are engaged in a cross-sectoral pilot project with the Department of Education, Catholic Education and SCSA to investigate the use of generative Artificial Intelligence (AI) to reduce teacher workload in the adoption and adaption of Version 9 of the Australian Curriculum.
- The project aims to investigate the how AI can produce quality assured lesson resources for all teachers, including those working in challenging environments with diverse student cohorts.
- Supported by Minister Buti, this is a two year project partly funded by the State Government and the Commonwealth Workload Reduction fund.

Australian Early Development Census

- The data collection for the Australian Early Development Census finishes on 28 June 2024.
- Now is the time to check that teachers and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders are nearing completion of the data collection.
- After the school has finalised all related activities, the School Profile can be downloaded from the Australian Early Development Census data collection system.


- EduFest WA will empower West Australian educators develop a culture of intrapreneurship and innovation in their school communities.
