Welcome to the July edition of the CAP News and to Term 3! Semester 1 was a busy time, filled with many opportunities for members. Here is a sample of some highlights.

- Over 100 teachers engaged in EAL/D Professional Learning
- Mathematics workshops in problem solving and reasoning proficiencies; implementing assessment; and planning and developing place value and number routines
- The Early Childhood Behaviour Engagement project cohort 3 is now complete. Leaders and teams have reflected on behaviour approaches to align with the Early Years Learning Framework
- Shifting the Balance early literacy project participants completed three online modules of Oral Language, Phonemic Awareness and Phonics
- 46 Aspiring and Middle Leaders engaged in workshops to curate their leadership skills and knowledge
- Professional networking for 30 secondary English teachers, with author Alex Thorpe proving a highlight
- A new intake of Highly Accomplished and Lead teachers commenced National Certification
- 11 schools and nearly 100 teachers engaged in AISWA's High Impact Practices program
- 66 Early Career Teachers engaged in rich professional learning as they embark on their new careers
- Over 60 leaders and educators attended workshops about AI in schools and classrooms
- 63 attendees and 30 training providers participated in the annual VET expo

FEATURED PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

PEEL REGION: Connection to Story and Routines in Mathematics K to Year 2 – 1 August

No matter how good an idea is, implementing new projects is not easy, particularly in the current landscape of busy and demanding workloads. Where teachers and leaders are spread too thin, they run the risk of constantly being reactive rather than proactive, leaving little time to improve, change and be effective. AISWA are delighted to present this workshop on de-implementation with international thought leaders Peter deWitt and Michael Nelson.
