POLICY UPDATES

SCSA P-10 Curriculum revisions - Mathematics

Proposed curriculum changes for the revised P-10 Mathematics Curriculum are now available for consultation. A series of workshops have been undertaken with one final online session remaining on 18 September. This session will familiarise stakeholders with the proposed curriculum including changes to the learning area content to assist them in completing the Authority's consultation survey. The consultation window will be open from 26 August until 27 September 2024. More information here.

Please note we have limited spots in the conference/workshop, so please register ASAP.


