	The AISWA course is provided free to those teachers who complete it and register at UWA. Failure to do so will incur a \$400.00 fee.

Course summary:

AISWA works in partnership with University of Western Australia to offer courses in Educational Leadership to its members. In 2016 there will be the opportunity for teachers in AISWA schools to complete a Masters' Degree in Educational Leadership through the university.

There is a significant cost reduction for teachers in AISWA member schools as a result of the university giving credit for the AISWA course in Administrative Leadership. This requires attendance for three days in January, one in April, the completion of required reading, a tutorial presentation and a 5000 word assignment.

In 2016 Students will study:
