This workshop is more suited to those who are not familiar with the NSIT than those who are currently using it to inform their school improvement plan.

Course Summary:

This one day professional learning workshop addresses one of the professional practices of the Australian Professional Standard for Principals; *leading improvement, innovation and change*.

The workshop is designed to provide leaders and aspiring leaders with knowledge of the latest research around school effectiveness and the nine domains of the National School Improvement Tool. There will be an opportunity to examine the *Tool* in detail and to develop the skills to make judgments about one's school/sub-school and where it stands in terms of the domains of the NSIT. Various ways of using the *Tool* will be explored.

During the workshop, participants will complete at least part of the NSIT, if not all of it, for their context. This will provide a clear direction of what to do next and will inform the school improvement plan.

It will be assumed that participants do not have a depth of knowledge of the NSIT as a large portion of the day will be spent analysing this document.
