

NEW METRICS FOR SUCCESS IN SCHOOLING MEASURING CAPABILITIES TWO-DAY MASTERCLASS WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE

This event will provide:

- insights into how (and why) schools are moving towards a 'new grammar' for schooling by reframing their approach to assessing and recognising student learning
- a deep dive into ARC's approach to assessment, recognition and credentialing of learning
- opportunities to explore assessment materials and technology to support this work
- case study exemplars drawing on ARC's work with schools in the *New Metrics for Success* and the *Big Picture* credentialing projects, and
- consideration of the opportunities for schools, including an assessment of 'readiness' to continue with this work in 2023.
