Applications are invited from registered psychologists with school-based experience to work with Independent schools in WA. The focus will be on the provision of consultative support to schools and school staff, with limited direct psychological services for students. The AISWA School Psychology Service (ASPS) seeks to provide an effective and efficient service to all AISWA schools within WA to optimise student learning and development.

The hours of work can be negotiated with the successful applicants and both full-time and part-time hours will be considered. The contracts will commence as soon as possible.

#### **The Role**

The AISWA School Psychologists work as part of a collaborative Psychology team. It will involve supporting AISWA schools across WA and requires travel.

#### **Essential Criteria**

1. Support the mission and vision of AISWA.
2. Demonstration of excellent skills and application of scientific practitioner model.
3. Previous experience working in schools.
4. Experience in mental health assessment, learning and cognitive assessment, and, behavioural assessment and intervention.
5. Highly developed ability to provide input into teaching and learning practices in the school to optimise learning and development.
6. Experience with management and intervention for critical incidents and policies.
7. Excellent interpersonal and communication skills.
8. Competent user of ICT in a work environment.
9. Eligible for registration with AHPRA as a psychologist.
10. Current Working with Children Check.
11. Current Driver's' Licence and own suitable vehicle.

#### **Desirable Criteria**

1. General registration with AHPRA Psychology Board of Australia
2. A tertiary qualification in Education and/or endorsement as an Educational and Developmental Psychologist.
3. Experience working with schools with a variety of educational, religious and philosophical backgrounds.
4. Knowledge of current trends and issues in welfare and child protection policies.
5. Experience and demonstrated effectiveness in the design and delivery of professional learning and training to adult populations.

## Employment Information Collection Notice

1. In applying for this position you will be providing AISWA with personal information. We can be contacted at PO Box 1817, Osborne Park DC WA 6916 or at 3/41 Walters Drive OSBORNE PARK WA 6017, or by phoning (08) 9441 1600.
2. If you provide us with personal information, for example, your legal name and address or information contained on your resume, we will collect the information in order to assess your application for employment. We may keep this information on file for a period of up to 60 days if your application is unsuccessful in case another position becomes available unless you advise us otherwise.
3. AISWA's Privacy Policy contains details of how you may complain about a breach of the Australian Privacy Principles (APP) or how you may seek access to personal information collected about you. However, there may be occasions when access is denied. Such occasions would include where access would have an unreasonable impact on the privacy of others.
