Summary

The Art Technician in the Hale Senior School will be responsible for the following: the ordering, preparation, organising, distribution and collection of materials and resources for the teaching, production and presentation of lessons in Art and the wider School environment; the maintenance of studio areas and resources; the provision of administration and communications to support the department.

Responsibilities

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- Prepare teaching materials and resources for Art classes in Years 7 12.
- Order, maintain and catalogue Art Department resources, as directed by Head of Department.
- Ensure chemical safety, including appropriate monitoring for all hazardous chemicals, protective safety gear, fume hoods and first aid kits within the Art Department.
- Maintain classrooms/studio areas by monitoring cleaning, maintenance, safety, security, and resource supplies.
- Assist with art projects in class, as directed by Head of Department. This may involve assisting students with work and procedures, cleaning and organising classrooms while a project is underway.
- Monitor and maintain security of IT resources and maintain the condition and safety of art equipment.
- Assist in the displaying of art works within the Art Department and wider school environment, including the annual Hale School Art Exhibition.
- Support associated student clubs and competitions.
- Undertake other duties as directed by the Head of Department.

- maintain an up to date and valid Working with Children Check

- if appropriate, meet professional standards for teachers and maintain teacher registration and,
- report to the Headmaster any criminal charges or convictions you receive during your employment that may indicate a possible risk to children and young people.

The Hale School community has zero-tolerance for child abuse, and all allegations and safety concerns are treated very seriously and consistently with our robust safeguards and procedures.

The Headmaster, at his sole discretion, reserves the right to vary your duties at any time. Such a variation of your duties does not constitute a breach of contract or termination of your employment. As part of the School's routine pre-employment practices, the School will contact your referees and/or previous employers to ask specific mandatory questions relating to Child Safety. We also reserve the right to conduct social media checks, as part of this process.

Qualifications and Experience

The Art Technician requires:

- a broad range of skills and knowledge associated with the tools, materials, processes and techniques required for the production and exhibition of two and three dimensional artworks.
- Experience in studio practice associated with the production and exhibition of artworks is desired.
- General IT competence with applications such as Outlook and Adobe Photoshop for communications within the Department and the wider School community.
- A genuine interest in visual arts and how it can be fostered and built upon in a school situation.
- A current driver's licence and computer literacy are essential.
