Update and develop resources that support high-quality approaches to curriculum, assessment and reporting practices. Represent AISWA and coordinate membership within SCSA and ACARA curriculum advisory groups, ensuring effective dissemination of key messages and insights internally and with member schools. Cultivate and expand learning area networks and communities of practice. Lead and provide support for STEM initiatives aligned with State and National priorities. Lead and provide support for bespoke programs, projects and initiatives aligned with State and National priorities. Provide support for senior secondary educators to address curriculum challenges and opportunities, including proposed senior secondary reforms. Adapt and refine resources and tools to effectively support P-12 curriculum implementation and improvement initiatives.
