Science studies are considered an integral part of the curriculum at the College and the Science Teacher will be expected to teach across the range of programmes from Year 7 to Year 12 and will be expected to teach the Chemistry and Physics ATAR course.

Duties

The Teacher will -

- Be committed to providing innovative and high-quality educational experiences
- Deliver curriculum programmes that reflect current WACE requirements as per the Western Australian Curriculum
- Effectively plan and deliver the age appropriate and/or WACE courses.
- Maintain moderating marking within a given year level or Upper School course
- Effectively deliver all course learning outcomes, assessment and reporting requirements
- Maintain knowledge of current practices, research and literature in Science teaching subjects
- Differentiate programming and delivery to accommodate the learning needs of individual students



- Provide a stimulating, helpful environment which is a focal point and showcase for students' learning achievements
- Liaise with parents on matters pertaining to their child by providing them with relevant information in accordance with College guidelines
- Liaise with the Head of Department in planning arrangements concerning special curriculum activities connected to the Department
- Assist with the extra Science sessions scheduled throughout the terms
