About the School

Strelley Community School is a remote Aboriginal Independent Community School located in Western Australia's Pilbara region. Established in 1976, it is the oldest continually operational Independent Aboriginal Community School in Australia. We operate across two campuses:

- Strelley (Yurtingunya) – 60 km east of Port Hedland
- Warralong (Karntimarta) – 160 km south-east of Port Hedland

With approximately 60 students from Kindergarten to Year 12, our learners are predominantly ESL/EALD and come from a Nyangumarta language background. We embrace and respect the language, culture, and history of our students and community. Our curriculum focuses on Literacy, Numeracy, and On-Country Learning, guided by values of learning, wisdom of Elders, belonging, harmony, honesty, respect, and courage – for a strong future.

The Role:

We have teaching positions available at both campuses for:

- Primary Teachers
- Early Years Teacher (Early Years qualification required)

Essential Requirements:

- Bachelor's degree or equivalent in Education
- Current Teacher Registration with TRBWA
- Working with Children Check (or ability to obtain)
- The Right to work in Australia (Australian or NZ citizen, permanent resident, or valid work visa – **sponsorship is not available**)

- Passion for teaching and living in a remote community
- Strong belief in every student's ability to succeed
- Comprehensive curriculum knowledge
- Commitment to a safe school environment
- Willingness to collaborate with staff and community

Desirable Criteria

- Current manual Australian Driver's License
- Experience teaching Indigenous children
- ESL/EALD teaching experience
- Ability to create and manage differentiated curriculum
